**NEW YORK:** The city's treasures – in art, music, theatre, fashion, design and food – are like the layers of an onion continually revealing themselves.

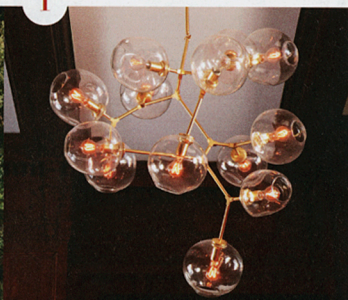
